
5. Number of Employees in the Plan: Two

It is believed that the Salary Continuation Plan Agreements do not constitute an employee pension benefit plan or pension plan as defined by Section 3 (2) (A) of ERISA, but if they do constitute an ERISA pension plan, the Plan would constitute an unfunded plan which provides deferred compensation for a select group of management or highly compensated employees.

The "administrator" of the plan is required to file the statement under the alternative method of compliance authorized by 29 C.F.R. §2520.104-23. The term "administrator" is not clearly defined and G.H. Leidenheimer Baking Co., Ltd., as plan sponsor, is filing this statement.
